Bond Update - Bond Sale to Webster Bank - Chief Nick Tyler:

- * Working through the processes and paperwork for the bond
- * Closing documents should be signed August 27th, 2024
- * Close and be funded on September 5th, 2024
- * Official lender letter read in its entirety by Chief Nick Tyler
- * Board Vice President Larry Johnson signed acknowledging the letter

Wildland Testing Process - Wildland Division Chief (WDC) Christian Whitfield

- * Testing has been going on for 2-3 weeks
- * 6 conditional job officers (1 seasonal position, 5 full time employees) with more to come, some starting as soon as tomorrow because those people are already volunteers with our district (no intake necessary)
- * 32 applicants for 7 different job classifications, up to 20 positions
- * Total of 14 positions currently planned between seasonal and full time
- * Two types of seasonal Fire Seasonal (4 months) and 10 month with 2 month layout (matches forest service)
- * Lots of excitement and applicants with this new crew

Wildland Project & Equipment - CWRR Manager Christian Whitfield

- * map of roads included in the contract
- * two of the proposed roads were on either side of the current Pyramid fire so those roads have been created during that response, there will be an equivalent amount of work that will replace those now existing roads to maintain the contract
- * WDC Christian Whitfield pointed out several locations and current activities on a map displayed on the large monitor

New Chipper

- * Unique product being built in Michigan, worked through procurement process, have a spot in production, should be delivered first of October
- * Christian Whitfield and Josh Starha got to go see production and try out equipment, comes with some great safety features, like outside access to change the knives which is great for maintenance and a dual feed system
- * Forest Service is also excited about potential use of chipper

Fire Training - AIC Ryan Paul:

Between 7/1/24 - 8/1/2024 crews completed:

- * 15 hours of online
- * 106 hours dedicated to drills
- * 86.5 hours on shift training
- * 24 hours of outside training
- * 40 hours for fire corp, sent some people to Portland

Total = 271.5 plus hours of training

Vehicle Maintenance & Equipment - BC Randy Whitfield:

- * Engine 25 rough three weeks on conflagration, has a list of issues and needed minor repairs, get back in a week or so
- * Rosenbauer was deployed, high pressure hoses worked really well, one small hose problem probably a factory defect
- * Medic 2 sent out for A/C problems but is back and working
- * Medic 4 brake and air conditioning problems, wheel bearing was put in improperly and will be covered by the shop
- * Medic 3 rear differential seal leaking
- * Pump testing done, all passed
- * Looking for new medic units, some promising new suppliers

R & R and Public Interactions - AIC Ryan Paul:

- * Part Time Program 1 leaving soon, 2 moving to casual 2 new starting and will reopen testing process
- * Volunteer candidates in various stages of the process headed to fall academy and will need to find more to replace those hired for the wildland program
- * 5 Chemeketa students
- * School Events starting to get scheduled
